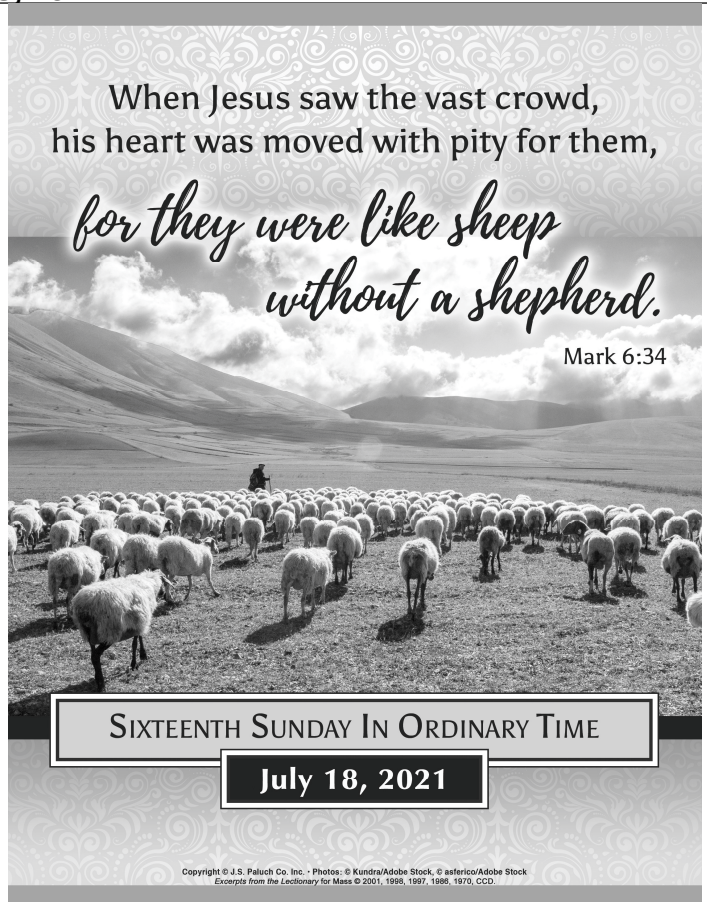

**Jesus, Our Peace**

You probably know that the Jews in the first century did not particularly like the Gentiles. Some of them who became Christians still looked down on the non-Jewish Christians. In the epistle today, Paul addresses this problem by reminding them that Jesus died for all people, Jew and Gentile. And just as Jesus rose from the dead to a new life, the converts to Christianity were given a new life also. That new life of baptism joined them all to Christ, who lives in them, forgives them, and brings them peace. So why was that unity so hard to accept?

One reason is that as much as we complain about laws and regulations, many people like to live by them. We even make our own rules: "I always eat breakfast at 7:15," or "I have to read the newspaper every morning." Even though our rules may not be bad in themselves, if we get angry at anyone who interrupts our routine, those rules lead us to sin. But some of the Hebrew Christians thought that they still had to keep the laws and regulations of the old covenant. There is nothing wrong with keeping the Ten Commandments: They are simply examples of Jesus' command to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself. So why not just do that?

The problem with only keeping commandments is that we can avoid doing evil things, but still not love God or my neighbor. For example, we can avoid using God's name in vain and kick back and relax on the Sabbath, but still not really love God. We can keep from killing, robbing, or lying to our neighbor, without loving anyone. Fortunately for us, God loves us first; we need only respond to that love. And if we make the decision to love God and our neighbors, and base all our other actions on that love, we will not break any commandments, or even worry about breaking them. We will have the peace that Paul mentions in our reading, the peace that makes us all one in Christ.

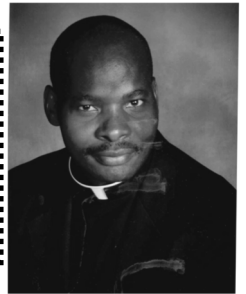

**FROM THE DESK OF BISHOP MCGOVERN:**

**POPE FRANCIS APPOINTS FATHER JOHN IFFERT BISHOP OF COVINGTON**

Pope Francis today appointed Father John Iffert, a priest of the Diocese of Belleville as the bishop-elect of the Diocese of Covington in Kentucky.

Bishop-elect Iffert, 53, has served as the Vicar General of the Diocese of Belleville since 2020. He is also currently the diocesan Moderator of the Curia and Pastor of St. Stephen Parish in Caseyville.

"I am astounded and deeply grateful that Pope Francis has elected me to serve as the eleventh Bishop of Covington, Kentucky" wrote Iffert in a letter to the faithful of southern Illinois. "I am inspired by Pope Francis' vision of a Church so deeply rooted in a relationship with Christ that we accompany the outcast, tend the wounded, mourn with the brokenhearted and rejoice and give thanks in every circumstance, and so carry out Jesus' mission of evangelization."

A native of DuQuoin, Bishop-elect Iffert is the youngest of John and Mary Iffert's three children. He grew up on the family farm on the outskirts of DuQuoin and attended Sacred Heart School and DuQuoin High School.

He holds a degree in political science and economics from Illinois State University. In August, 1992 he entered Mundelein Seminary where he earned a bachelor's degree of Sacred Theology and a Master of Divinity degree. On June 7, 1997 Bishop Wilton Gregory ordained Iffert a priest of the Diocese of Belleville.

After ordination to the priesthood, Iffert served as Pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish in Columbia, St. Mary Parish in Mt. Vernon and St. Barbara Parish in Scheller.

Additional diocesan responsibilities have included membership on the College of Consultors, the Priest Personnel Board, and the Diocesan Finance Council.

"Bishop-elect Iffert is an excellent priest and a dedicated pastor, and he is widely respected in our diocese" wrote Belleville Bishop Michael McGovern in a letter to the faithful. "With his strong faith and many talents, I believe Bishop-elect Iffert will be an excellent shepherd for the people of northern Kentucky."

Bishop-elect Iffert will be ordained and installed as the eleventh Bishop of Covington on September 30 in the Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption. He succeeds Bishop Roger Foys who is retiring after leading the diocese since 2002.

Established in 1853, the Diocese of Covington encompasses the City of Covington and the counties of northern Kentucky. The diocese has 48 parishes and approximately 90,000 Catholics within 3,358 square miles.
