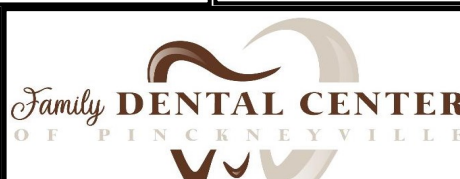

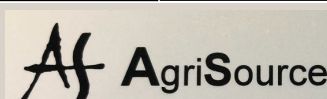

PERRY COUNTY PARISHES LITURGY AND WORSHIP COMMITTEE

Liturgy is always an act of praise of and to God. The ‘theme’ of every liturgy is the paschal mystery, that is, the life, death and resurrection of Christ. Liturgy (all liturgy, not only Mass) is the peak activity of the Church. How to make our Perry County Parishes liturgy more vibrant, meaningful, and inclusive has been my concern ever since my arrival. We need to incorporate elements that encourage active participation from the congregation during liturgical celebrations. One of the possible means of achieving this is to have a Liturgy Committee.

What are the roles of the Liturgy Committee?

The roles of the Liturgy Committee are to evaluate liturgical practice, but particularly to serve as a liaison between liturgical celebrations and other related areas of parish life. This committee is responsible for such things as assessing the needs of the parish community, sometimes providing parish retreats, missions, days of recollection for different groups, and so on. They also respond to such questions as how the parish is going to celebrate the liturgical seasons especially in Advent, Christmas, Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. However, the Liturgy Committee reviews the liturgical procedures in accordance with General Instructions of the Roman Missal and pastoral consideration. Thus, the liturgy is seen to be more than a Sunday morning ritual: It is the common prayer of the community and, as such, it must both flow over into people’s personal and social lives. The members of this committee consist of the coordinators of our Altar Servers, Environment and Art, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Ushers, Lectors, and Music Directors, Deacon, and the Priest.

We wish to officially constitute this committee soon in the four Perry County Parishes. I appreciate all those who have been supportive in various areas in regards to liturgy in our parishes. God bless you all.
