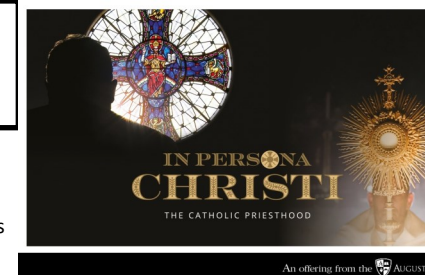

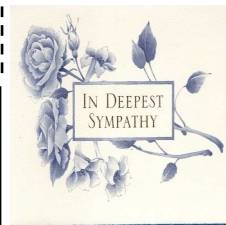

DOES EVERYBODY GO TO HEAVEN?

*A Reflection on “the life of the World to Come”

Bishop Braxton will explain the teachings of the Catholic Church about Heaven, Hell, Purgatory, and Limbo, as presented in The Catechism of the Catholic Church. He will also examine the prevailing secular, scientific world view that rejects the possibility of “life after death.” He will clarify the difference between “the immortality of the human soul” and “the resurrection of the body” and explain why the Catholic Funeral Mass is correctly called “The Liturgy of Christian Burial” and not “The Mass of the Resurrection.”

The presentation will conclude with time for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament for family members and friends who have died.
