



A CALL TO BLESS A RELIGIOUS ITEMS BY A PREIST OR DEA-CON BEFORE USE. What does the word "sacramental" mean? It is a sign, while Sacramentals are sacred signs signifying spiritual effects obtained by the prayer of the church (Canon 1166). Sacramental gives grace through the prayers of the Church and the faith of the recipients. Common Examples of

Holy Water: Used for blessings and to remind the faithful of their baptism. Crucifixes: Represent the sacrifice of Jesus and are often used in prayer. Rosaries: A tool for prayer that helps in meditating on the life of Christ and the Virgin Mary. Medals: Such as the Miraculous Medal, which are worn for ize prayers rising to God. Holy Oils: Used in sacraments like Baptism, Confirmation, and Anointing of the Sick. Holy pictures and images. Etc.

What does it mean for an object to be blessed? The blessing of objects, for example, water, a building, or a piece of jewelry is meant to set that object

Purpose of blessing a car by a priest. A blessing is often intended to invoke divine protection and guidance for the vehicle and its occupants.
