

Lost sheep. Lost coin. Lost child. Losing a possession is one thing. Losing one's way is something else. Today's examples: (1) The people of Exodus so lost their way to God, they turned to a molten calf of their own design. Worshiping something that is not God is idolatry, is deep down infidelity, is mistrust of God. Moses pleads for these stiffnecked people. And God relents; God does not punish. (2) The prodigal son thought owning things and going far off was the way to live. He comes to his senses and returns home and finds his father – filled with compassion – running to embrace him. The point: it is God's very nature to relent, to exude compassion, to run to us, to love.

# A CALL TO BLESS A RELIGIOUS ITEMS BY A PREIST OR DEACON BEFORE USE.

What does the word "sacramental" mean? It is a sign, while Sacramentals are sacred signs signifying spiritual effects obtained by the prayer of the church (Canon 1166). Sacramental gives grace through the prayers of the Church and the faith of the recipients.

Common Examples of Sacramentals:

Holy Water: Used for blessings and to remind the faithful of their baptism. Crucifixes: Represent the sacrifice of Jesus and are often used in prayer. Rosaries: A tool for prayer that helps in meditating on the life of Christ and the Virgin Mary. Medals: Such as the Miraculous Medal, which are worn for protection and inspiration.

Incense: Used in liturgical celebrations to symbolize prayers rising to God. Holy Oils: Used in sacraments like Baptism, Confirmation, and Anointing of the Sick. Holy pictures and images. Etc.

These items become sacramentals and effective when they are blessed by a priest or deacon. These items and practices help Catholics to grow in their faith and connect more deeply with the divine.

What does it mean for an object to be blessed? The blessing of objects, for example, water, a building, or a piece of jewelry is meant to set that object apart for holy use. Water becomes holy water, a building a Church, and jewelry a holy medal. Once a blessing is imparted by a priest or deacon, the object should be treated with respect and not disposed of casually or disrespectfully. The object, in being blessed, has become the bearer of a blessing. Why does a priest bless a house of believers? For example, if a priest blesses a house of believers, the blessing makes those who live there better disposed to trust in God and to invoke His protection with greater confidence. Purpose of blessing a car by a priest. A blessing is often intended to invoke divine protection and guidance for the vehicle and its occupants. It symbolizes a request for safe travels and guidance during journeys. If you would like an item blessed by Fr. John or Deacon Tony you are welcome to bring it to Mass or coordinate a time with the parish office.
